The Winning Strides Riding School is committed to providing safe, effective, and fun horsemanship in either the Western or English discipline for beginner and intermediate riders. We teach from the ground up including catching, haltering, grooming, tacking, mounting, and riding.

Students learn formal balanced position, use of the natural aids and fun activities on well-schooled horses. This foundation will prepare you to pursue many equine endeavors. Our certified instructors are experienced, dedicated, and keen to share their love of riding.

Our Information and Registration Package includes: student information, registration information and forms, payment information, general rules and summer camp brochures, lesson schedule, and instructor biographies. We conduct three sessions throughout the year including Spring Session (8 weeks - April, May & June) Summer Riding Camps (8 weeks - July & August) and Fall Session (8 weeks - September, October & November.)

The following information will give you all the particulars required to participate in our riding school and we look forward to many happy trails together!

Student Information

All riders, students, parents and guardians must read, understand and submit the liability waiver form before the first lesson. If riders choose not to use a helmet, they must sign an additional "Safety Equipment Acknowledgement and Release Form". All safety equipment waivers must be signed in front of a WS staff member. Waivers must be signed each calendar year.

All riders are required to wear an approved ASTM helmet designated for equine activities, which is equipped with a safety chinstrap. They are mandatory for children under the age of 18 riding in lessons. Hard-soled footwear with a heel sufficient in height to restrict the foot from passing through the stirrup are also required. In addition, long pants are necessary.

Horses, helmets, boots and tack are provided if required. Please ensure any equipment does not go home with you. The first lesson of each session includes: meeting instructor and other students, stable orientation, safety rules and assignment of equipment. First lesson riding time may be limited depending on the level of the class. We accept students to use their own horses following an instructor assessment.

In the event that you are unable to attend a lesson please notify your instructor, 24-hour's notice is required. Every attempt will be given for a make-up lesson, which you must book with an instructor during an available lesson time. If you know further in advance more notice is appreciated. Please let us know if you are not able to attend, regardless of the time frame. **Make-up lessons must be fulfilled within the current lesson session and cannot be carried over as a credit from one year to the next.**

The sessions may include at least two unmounted lessons. These lessons often include ground work, parts of the horse, colours and breeds, tack, horse management, equipment care and horse psychology. Assigned horses may vary during lessons for the best advancement of the student. Please do not hand feed any horses, put approved treats in a feeder or bucket. Clean up after your horse & sweep after riding if required.

We only provide private lessons to evaluate a rider or for a limited time to assess rider skills and/or horse proficiency. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to your lesson in order to be prepared with helmet and boots on. Find your assigned horse and begin grooming. Allow at least 15 minutes after the lesson to ensure all equipment is put away including your horse. Working swiftly allows for the most time riding.

Lesson priority is given to WS boarders and existing students; we welcome new students upon availability.

The facility is not heated so dress accordingly (in layers), as classes are not cancelled unless travel is unsafe or temperatures go below -10C. Always assume the lesson is on unless we contact you. Every effort will be made to provide advanced notice should a lesson be cancelled. If a lesson is cancelled, a makeup class will be added to the end of the session. If the weather is questionable be sure to check your email, phone messages or WS Facebook page before travelling to WS.

Please work in a cooperative and enjoyable manner with other students and instructors. Your success is important to us so please let us know if you have any suggestions.

Registration Information

All students must complete a WS registration form. Please refer to the current lesson schedule and choose two (2) preferred days, times and instructor. Students are grouped (min. 2 & max. 6) based on age, ability and experience. Let us know if you have other preferences, we will do our best to accommodate you.

Instructor bios are available; they are listed on page 6 & 7 in this package.

The liability waiver must be filled out and submitted each year before students are allowed to ride. The waiver is available within this package on pages 12 & 13. There are separate waivers for children "Under the Age of Majority" (page 12) and adults "Over the Age of Majority" (page 13). Please be sure you are filling out and submitting the correct one.

Payment Information

Pricing is as follows:

- Spring Session (April, May & June): \$300.00 + GST
- Summer Camps (July & August): \$300.00 + GST
- Fall Session (September, October & November): \$300.00 + GST

Payment options include: Full payment via e-transfer, cheque or cash. Monthly payments via pre-authorized debit (PAD). Please choose preferred payment option on the registration form. For pre-authorized debit (PAD) print the form found on pages 14-16 of this registration package and fill it in and return this completed form to Laurie Messner via email, mail or barn office mail box. GST is added to all services.

No refunds will be given after the first class.

General Rules

instructors are of the highest caliber, please trust their skills and abilities and refrain from offering your own instruction. If you have any questions regarding lessons, we welcome any dialog before or after the lesson.

Please supervise other children that may accompany you to lessons. No running, yelling or playing tag is permitted. Be sure spectators are not disturbing the lesson. No strollers in the barns. Never put toddlers or babies on the ground in the barns, they must be held in your arms and out of contact with the horses. Please keep little fingers out of harm's way.

We appreciate first time visitors being aware of the general rules. Caution to anyone at our facility, closed-toe footwear is strongly recommended for safety reasons.

All dogs must be on leash. Please ensure that you clean up after your pet. If your dog is unsociable or chases cats, it's easier on everyone if they are kept at home.

Smoking is prohibited everywhere except the parking area, please be respectful when disposing of butts.

Many young riders use this facility; please refrain from foul or abusive language, wearing offensive T-shirts, etc.

Winning Strides is a private facility, only come to the house when invited, unless of course in the case of an emergency.

Please notify WS staff if anything requires attention.

1. I am the Parent/Guardian of the Infant Participant and am executing this waiver on behalf of the Infant Participant in my capacity as Parent/Guardian and with the intent that his waiver be binding on myself and the Infant Participant for all legal purposes.
2. I am aware that there are inherent dangers, hazards and risks ("Risks") associated with "Equine Activities" and injuries resulting from these "Risks" are a common occurrence. I am aware that the "Risks" of "Equine Activities" mean those dangerous conditions which are an integral part of "Equine Activities", including but not limited to:
 - (a) the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and to potentially collide with, bite or kick other animals, people or objects;
 - (b) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, tremors, vibrations, unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals and hazards such as subsurface objects; and
 - (c) the potential for other participants to behave in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to themselves or others, including failing to act within their abilities to maintain control over an equine.
3. I freely accept and fully assume all responsibility for all "Risks" and possibilities of any and all personal injury, death, property damage or loss resulting from the Infant Participant's participation in "Equine Activities".
4. Terms & Conditions

The undersigned ("the Payor"), jointly and severally if more than one, agrees with the Payee, the Processing Institution and RBC as follows:

The Payor acknowledges that this Authorization is provided for the benefit of the Payee and the Processing Institution and is provided in consideration of the Processing Institution agreeing to process debits against the Payor's account in accordance with the rules of the Canadian Payments Association.

1. The Payee and the Processing Institution are authorized to draw on the Account by RBC issuing debits, in paper, electronic or other form for the purpose of variable amount on the 1st of the month until the boarding contract has been terminated along with this Authorization agreement. Which amount may be increased/decreased at any future date and /or which payment date may be changed at any future date in accordance with any agreement in writing between the Payor and Payee. The Payee will, to the best of its ability, forward a statement of account in support of the debits at least 10 days after the payment was processed.

2. The Payor represents, acknowledges and agrees that:

Execution and delivery of the Authorization to the Payee constitutes delivery by the Payor to the Processing Institution;

The debits herein authorized are either personal/household or Business related.

The Processing Institution is not required to verify that the debits herein authorized have been issued in accordance with the particulars of this Authorization, including the amount and frequency of payments;

The Processing Institution is required to verify that the amount and purpose of payment for which the debit was issued has been fulfilled by the Payee as a condition to honouring a debit issued or caused to be issued by the Payee on the Account.
